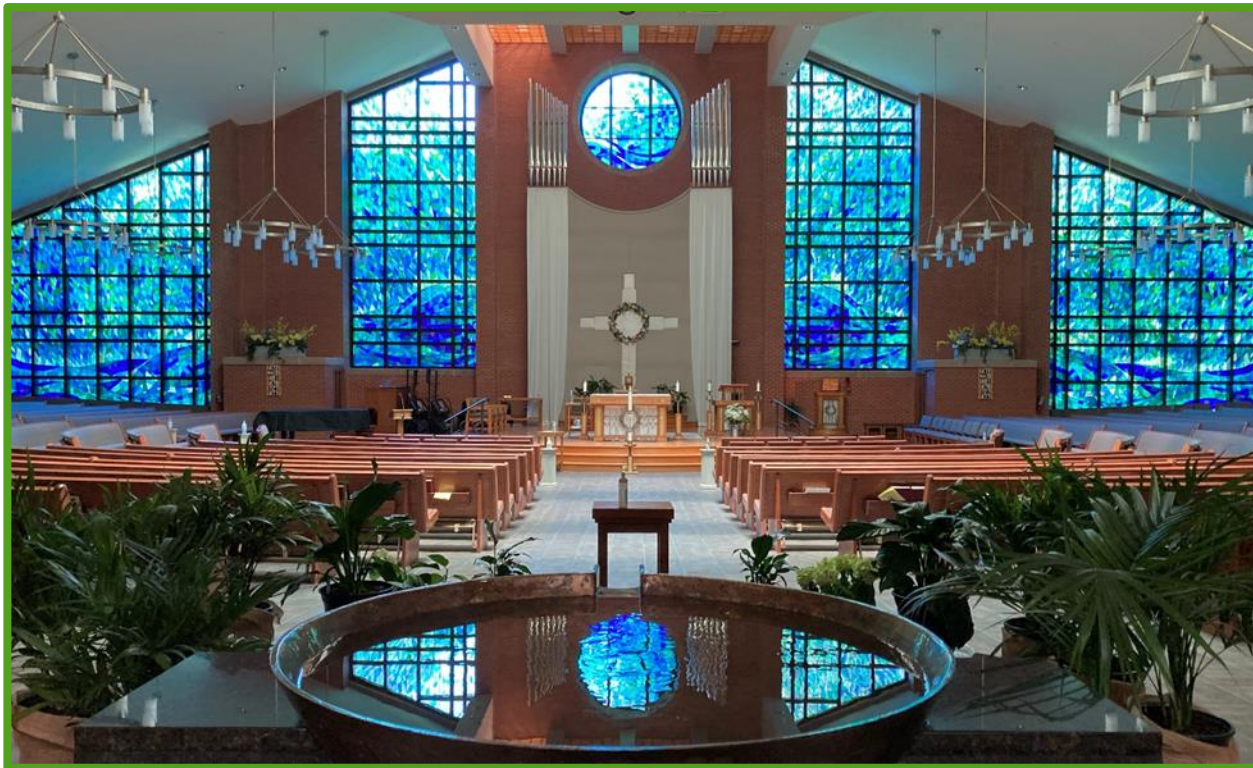


## St. John Neumann Parish in Reston, Virginia, USA

### LAUDATO SI' ACTION PLAN Year 1

October 2022 – September 2023



*This plan was developed as a collaboration among the Care for Our Common Home ministry and staff leads for submittal to the [Vatican Laudato Si' Action Platform](#).*

**RESPONSE TO THE CRY OF THE EARTH** is a call to protect our common home for the wellbeing of all, as we equitably address the climate crisis, biodiversity loss, and ecological sustainability.

- Investigate and refine current purchase of **renewable energy certificates** from Dominion Energy to ensure best fit for the parish's energy usage.
- Complete mulching of final segment of **Prayer Loop**.
- Organize a "**Weeding Ministry**" that will take on future maintenance of Mary Garden, pollinator garden and other parts of Parish Grounds.
- Investigate pros and cons of using a landscape contractor that uses **electric leaf blowers**. Learn how the landscaping contract is determined.
- Gather information and parent attitude for a **No Idling Campaign** for cars queueing up in front of church.
- Work with Eagle Scout to build a "**Native Plant Mary Garden**" in front of the church.

**RESPONSE TO THE CRY OF THE POOR** is a call to promote eco-justice, aware that we are called to defend human life from conception to death, and all forms of life on Earth.

- Continue supporting the numerous parish outreach activities that provide **food to the hungry**. (Cornerstones "brown Bag" collections, Thanksgiving food drive, Shelter Meal Program and others)
- Continue supporting the numerous parish outreach activities that **interact one on one** with the lonely, discouraged and homeless. (Hypothermia Shelter, Lamb Center breakfasts, FACETS Hot Meals, and others)
- Continue offering **special collections** to raise funds for pro-life organizations, parish youth group outreach activities and victims of natural disasters.

**ECOLOGICAL ECONOMICS** acknowledges that the economy is a sub-system of human society, which itself is embedded within the biosphere—our common home.

- Continue annual **Fair-Trade event** to empower those living in poverty to change their lives and their communities.
- Develop a **voluntary carbon tax** or fee program for interested parishioners.
- Develop a master list of preferred **paper/compostable items**, where to purchase, and cost comparisons.
- Create a policy on **socially responsible purchasing** and use of kitchen for parish events.

**ADOPTION OF SUSTAINABLE LIFESTYLES** is grounded in the idea of sufficiency, and promoting sobriety in the use of resources and energy.

- Continue to provide **dishwashing services** for parish events to reduce use of resources.
- Educate and encourage families in a target audience (from CCH mailing list) to **enroll in LSAP**.
- Reinstate **composting program** with outside provider to make it a weekly occurrence. Train custodial staff and educate kitchen users.
- Assist the **Farmer's market** with educational and outreach activities pertaining to sustainability
- Communicate with parishioners the ways for households to **reduce use of single use items**.
- Train selected Ministry Leads and staff in **Dishwashing Protocol**

**ECOLOGICAL EDUCATION** is about rethinking and redesigning curricular and institutional reform in the spirit of integral ecology in order to foster ecological awareness and transformative action.

- Director of RE to observe and note how each event throughout the year might be done with **less consumption and waste** to be good stewards of parishioners' financial contributions.
- Throughout the year, bookmark the lessons for each grade level that are appropriate for expounding on **care for creation** beyond what the curriculum provides.
- Create a list of **Faith in Action activities** for RE students. Include enrollment in LSAP as a family.
- Organize **film screenings** or guest speakers on CST issues.
- **Investigate benefits**, limitations and costs of using dishwasher at parish events.
- Emphasize the themes of **CST** to catechists during training and throughout the year.
- **Develop/collect resources** for catechists for the bookmarked lessons for use in the following year.
- With the help of a local expert, undertake a partial **inventory of the birds and plants** found on the Parish grounds.
- Offer **Laudato Si' Study Sessions** for any interested parishioners.

**ECOLOGICAL SPIRITUALITY** springs from a profound ecological conversion and helps us to “discover God in all things”, both in the beauty of creation and in the sighs of the sick and the groans of the afflicted, aware that the life of the spirit is not dissociated from worldly realities.

- Integrate Catholic Social Teaching (including Care for Creation) into the Liturgy through **Prayer of the Faithful intentions**. Compile and share list of suggestions.
- Develop an annual **Season of Creation calendar of events**, including bulletin inserts, spiritual reflections and a parish wide education event.
- Identify Sundays in the lectionary cycle with **readings that touch on Laudato Si' themes**. Collect resources and provide to Office of Liturgy for sharing.
- Research and identify Salesian examples of **spiritual lessons from nature**. Include them in the bulletin throughout the year.
- Investigate definition and examples of **eco-spirituality** and **eco-conversion**.
- Observe opportunities to **include silence** into liturgical prayer. Encourage parishioners to spend quiet time in the church during times of waiting.
- Research, prepare and pilot **contemplative prayer services** that include themes of caring for creation. Offer to CCH ministry participants.
- Provide information sessions on **Centering Prayer** for any interested parishioners. Coordinate with Spanish Leaders.

**COMMUNITY RESILIENCE AND EMPOWERMENT (ADVOCACY)** envisage a synodal journey of community engagement and participatory action at various levels.

- Highlight **current advocacy issues** that align with CST and offer opportunities for social justice ministry parishioners to participate.
- Continue the numerous outreach activities to **provide gifts to the less fortunate**. (Backpack collection program, Laurel learning center birthday gifts, Christmas Angel gifts, and others)
- Continue to **support those with special needs** or concerns in the community. (Eucharist to the Homebound, Prison Ministry, Welcome the Stranger, Recovery and Addiction Ministry, Divorced and Separated Ministry and others)
- Meet with Cornerstones to assess needs for **weatherization** services in rental units. Assess their interest in grants from Inflation Reduction Act.
- Offer **Advocacy 101** to interested parishioners.
