## **KEY DATES FOR CONSIDERATION**

The dates listed here include major Catholic feast days and celebrations, along with the days of saints who are often associated with aspects of Creation Care or who are referenced in <u>Laudato Si</u>'. Worldwide days on which humanity works together toward some aspect of planetary health are also listed.
